David, on the one hand, is a complicated, contorted, and problematic figure; on the other hand, he was one of God's favorites (Psalm 17:8; Acts 13:33). An argument can be made that he was "God's rotten apple." Look at the checklist—murder, adultery, lies, and covetousness—if ever there existed a poster child for breaking the Ten Commandments, David was it. But he was also the prototype of Israel's future Messiah. Jesus will have as one of his titles, the son of David. Yet, when we think of David, he is most known as the apple of God's eye, despite the serious flaws.

Many people, religious or non-religious, are familiar with David, especially the story of Goliath, but David's life is far more profound than this famous story. This book is the first volume of the fruits of the study of a personality that fascinates and rivals the most prominent Biblical figures like Jesus, Moses, Abraham, Peter, John, and Paul.

Having observed sports teams, military, businesses, universities, countries, and churches, one axiom emerges: "Leadership is destiny." The fate of any entity is correlated to its leadership.
